Keynote Speakers



Adesh Jain is one of the well known visionary and thought leaders. His passion in strengthening project management movement globally is well recognized.

Adesh completed his BS (Mathematics), BS in Electrical Engineering and Masters in Engineering in Control Systems in Canada. He worked for six years in the fields of Artificial Intelligence and Super

Computing in Canada/USA before returning to India in 1973. He pioneered the computerization movement in India for which he was awarded the Fellowship of CSI by the then President of Republic of India in 1991. Today, India is well recognized for IT. Besides IT, he has been associated with project/program management since 1967 and was architect of Integrated Project Management Systems (IPMS) for the largest engineering company in India in 1977.

Since 1992, he is working full time in the field of project management. He has written numerous articles and is a sought after keynote speaker. Recently, he was invited to speak at the PM Challenge 2010 organized by NASA in Galveston, USA. He was the Keynote Speaker at 24th IPMA World Congress in Istanbul, Turkey held in November 2010. His presentation was on "Breaking and creating boundaries – the key to innovation & excellence". In 2006, he was also made the Honorary Chairman of China Project Management Committee.

The President of India has appointed Adesh Jain as an Independent Director of the largest energy company of India – NTPC Ltd. He is Honorary President of PMA, India and Director In Charges of Centre for Excellence in Project Management. He was the first non-European President and Chairman of IPMA in 2005 and 2007 respectively. He supported the PMA, Nepal and in formation of recognition of his contribution in November 2010, he was made the Honorary Member of PMA, Nepal.

In short, he is a visionary leader shaping the project management movement globally.



Dr. Louis Klein is a leading expert in the field of social complexity, a dedicated scientist and international management consultant. His recent concern is with complex projects and change management on a global, cross-cultural stage.

Dr. Klein studied management sciences, cybernetics, sociology, anthropology, psychology, philosophy and economics at

universities in Germany and the UK. Dr. Klein holds a PhD in sociology with a focus on systems theory. During the years after the German Unification he worked in the economic transformation of the former GDR with a focus on the changes in accounting and controlling standards. His further career brought him as a director and project manager to banking, advertising and new media. Finally he joint Daimler Benz as an internal consultant.

In 2001 Dr. Klein founded the Systemic Excellence Group as an independent think tank for leading practice (www.SEgroup.de). Today SEgroup operates globally in change management and project performance issues. Large scale change projects are also part of his schedule as in depth field research resulting to a long list of academic publications.

Dr. Klein is Vice President of the International Society for the Systems Sciences (www.ISSS.org) and Focus group chair at the International Center for Complex Project Management (www.ICCPM.com). He teaches next to some assignments in Switzerland and the UK at the Berlin School of Creative Leadership (www.Berlin-School.com). He serves a Head of Project Studies at the Humboldt-Viadrina School of Governance (www.Humboldt-Viadrina.org).

In 2010 Dr. Klein was awarded the Inaugural Research prize of the International Center for Complex Project Management for his works on social complexity in project management.
